MESSAGE FROM TYNE & WEAR FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE

With the darker nights coming, there are plenty of things that you can do to keep yourself and your home safe. Firstly, make sure you bring in your wheelie bin at the earliest possibility. Sadly, wheelie bins are often the target for deliberate fires so bringing them in quickly helps to reduce the risk. If you suffer from deliberate fires in your area did you know that you can call FireStoppers on 0800 169 5558 and provide information anonymously?

As the bonfire period approaches, if you're buying fireworks – only buy them from licensed retailers and ensure they have the CE mark. After your celebrations if you have unwanted fireworks try to return them to the store where they were purchased for safe disposal. But if you are celebrating we'd always advise you to attend an organised display rather than to have your own event. Organised events will be advertised in your local paper.

Storing fireworks in your home to sell online without a license is dangerous and illegal. We use social media to identify and track the illegal sale and storage of fireworks.

If you have young people in your family, talk to them about not misusing fireworks and about respecting the emergency services – the fire service often receive more levels of abuse during the autumn months.

Please regularly check your smoke alarms, make sure you have a working alarm on each level of your home, test it regularly and have an agreed fire escape plan for the whole family. If you do have a fire in your home, don't try and put it out yourself – Get Out, Stay Out and call 999 – that's what Tyne and Wear Fire and Rescue service is here to do!

Let's keep your neighbourhood safe, report concerns anonymously to the police.
